Viruses —

Please be vigilant but we don't currently have any cases.

<u>Chickenpox</u>

Cases of chickenpox need to stay away from school until all the spots have formed a scab. This is usually 5 days after the spots appeared, but may take longer. More information can be found on the NHS website: <u>Chickenpox - NHS (www.nhs.uk)</u>

Scarlet fever

It is important that children with symptoms of scarlet fever are reviewed by their GP and should stay away from school for at least 24 hours after starting antibiotic treatment, to avoid spreading the infection. Without antibiotics, children can remain infectious for 2-3 weeks and should remain off school. The NHS website is also a useful resource: <u>https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/Scarlet-fever/</u>

Therefore, if you do believe your child has symptoms of scarlet fever you must speak with your GP before they return to school. There is currently a rise in cases across the country.

The reason it becomes more of a concern if scarlet fever and chicken pox are present in the same class at the same time, is that if open sores/wounds come into contact with the scarlet fever virus it can lead to other infections e.g. cellulitis.

Therefore, all those off with chicken pox are asked to be sure that the spots are fully crusted over, before they return to school, this will hope-fully keep them from becoming infected.
