

September 2021 Operational plan and Contingency plan

These are the control measures we have in place with our priority to deliver face-to-face, high quality education to all children in the safest environment for children, staff and families. Attendance at school is mandatory, we continue to request that everyone remains vigilant and honest about the health of their family to keep everyone safe.

All stakeholders agree that a child with <u>symptoms of COVID-19</u> should not attend school unless they receive a negative PCR test result, given the potential risk to others, school can take the decision to refuse the child if in their reasonable judgement it is necessary to protect the pupils and staff from possible infection with coronavirus (COVID-19).

Any such decision would be carefully considered in light of all the circumstances. We thank everyone for their co-operation and understanding.

1. Good hygiene for everyone	 Hand Hygiene ➤ Frequent and thorough hand cleaning is now regular practice. ➤ This can be done with soap and water or hand sanitiser. Respiratory Hygiene ➤ The use of tissues to catch sneezes placed in bins and then washing of hands. 			
2. Regular cleaning	Regular cleaning of areas and equipment with a particular focus on frequently touched surfaces.			
3. Good ventilation	We will ensure occupied rooms will be well ventilated. > Windows/external doors open > Internal classroom door open This will be balanced with the need for comfortable room temperature. DFE will be providing carbon dioxide monitors in the autumn term.			
4. Follow public health advice on testing, self- isolation and managing confirmed cases of COVID-19.	 We will follow advice given for testing and self-isolation at the time of the case. We will follow contingency plans for cases. 			
Staff will be completing twice weekly lateral flow tests.	This is currently advised until the end of September when it will be reviewed.

Self-Isolation and positive cases

In event of Confirmed and Increased cases of COVID-19

If 5 children, pupils, students or staff, who are likely to have mixed closely, test positive for COVID-19 within a 10-day period;	Seek additional public health advice if concerned about transmission in the setting, either by phoning the DfE helpline (0800 046 8687, option 1) or in line with other local arrangements. A director of public health or an HPT may give settings advice reflecting the local situation.	When 5 close contacts within 10 days are confirmed	Headteacher	School will act upon advice given. They may also return to bubbles to limit contacts. School will implement contingency plan for remote education if it is advised to. Families will be communicated with by telephone/email.
We will seek public health advice if a pupil, or staff member is admitted to hospital with COVID-19. - across an area, on government advice in order to supress or manage a dangerous variant and to prevent unsustainable pressure on the NHS.
